#### **OVERVIEW**

In March 2021, the New York City Racial Justice Commission (RJC) was formed to address structural racism in the policies and procedures that govern our city. Before the end of the year, the Commission will propose changes to the NYC Charter—the City's constitution. The effort is intended to identify, acknowledge, and eradicate structural racism by changing the Charter.

The Commission will examine the NYC Charter to identify barriers to power, access, and opportunity for Black, Indigenous, Latinx, and Asian, Pacific Islander, Middle Eastern and all People of Color\* in New York City and will put forward ballot proposals aimed at removing those barriers and advancing racial equity. New Yorkers will vote on these proposed changes in November 2022.
